


Make your mark at UAB.








See the world around you.


UAB is settled right into the heart of Alabama's largest

UAB ATHLETICS





HOW TO BECOME A BLAZER



VISIT US ONLINE

Check out **www.uab.edu**. You'll find everything you need to get to know UAB, apply online, find financial aid, and much more—all at your fingertips.



APPLY

Apply online at **www.uab.edu/apply** and pay the \$30.00 application fee. You must declare a major on your application to obtain the immigration document for your student visa.

You'll also need:

- Secondary School Evaluation: Request a document-by-document evaluation or general evaluation and a grade point average (GPA) computation from either evaluation agency listed in the box on page 9. Request that a copy of the completed evaluation be sent directly to UAB Undergraduate Admission.
- Secondary School Evaluation with Advanced Academic Programs: You may be eligible to receive high school equivalency and some transferable undergraduate college credit. If applicable, request a course-bycourse or general evaluation as well as a GPA computation from one of the evaluation agencies on page 9. Request that a copy of the completed evaluation be sent directly to UAB Undergraduate Admission.
- ACT/SAT Score: If you have no college work or have attended college less than one year, you must submit official ACT or SAT scores. UAB requires a minimum ACT score of 20 or a minimum SAT combined score of 950 (critical reading + math). You should contact the appropriate testing agency (listed on page 9) and request that it send your official scores to UAB Undergraduate Admission.
- College or University Evaluation: If you have attended a college or university outside the U.S. for more than one year, request a course-by-course evaluation from one of the agencies listed on page 9. If you have attended a college or university outside of the U.S. for less than one year, request both a document-by-document evaluation with GPA computation and a course-by-

course evaluation from one of the evaluation agencies listed on page 9. Request that the completed evaluation be sent directly to UAB Undergraduate Admission (see box on page 9 for TOEFL information).

- TOEFL Results: An official TOEFL score is required if English is not your native language. You must have a minimum score of 61 on the Internet-based version, a minimum score of 500 on the written examination, or a minimum score of 173 on the computer-based version. The score submitted should not be more than two years old. The agencies listed in the box on page 9 can provide details on the TOEFL.
- Official Transcripts: If you attended high school or college in the U.S., official transcripts from each institution are required. The transcripts must be mailed directly to UAB from each institution.



TRANSFER YOUR CREDITS

If you have attended a college or university outside of the U.S., you must provide a course description and syllabus for each course that will transfer to UAB. For more details about this very important information, go to UAB Academic Programs and Policies at **app.uab.edu/intl_articulation.asp**.



VISIT US IN PERSON

Take a student-guided walking tour for an insider's perspective on all of the excitement that is life at UAB. You'll get to explore UAB from the classrooms to the hubs of student life. Plus there's an information session with an admission counselor who will answer your questions. APPLY FOR A STUDENT VISA

UAB International Scholar and Student Services is responsible for sending the immigration document needed (Form I-20 or Form DS2019) for you to acquire a visa or maintain immigration status while living in the U.S. Immigration documents will be mailed only after you have been admitted to UAB as a degree-seeking student and after you submit the following documents:

- · an affidavit of financial support
- a bank statement from your sponsor's financial institution showing the balance (in U.S. dollars) in your sponsor's bank account
- a transfer clearance form (required only for students transferring to UAB from within the U.S.)



GET STUDENT HEALTH INSURANCE

When you're admitted to UAB, you're required to:

- have a medical health history provided by a physician (forms are available at www.uab.edu/studenthealth);
- have proof of vaccinations for tetanus, diphtheria, and rubeola, plus a tuberculin skin test;
- participate in the UAB Student Health Service (no exceptions); and
- have hospitalization insurance, either through UAB or a comparable insurance policy. You will be charged for UAB insurance unless comparable coverage is purchased and presented prior to the last day of late registration.
