Nihon University, founded in 1889, is the largest university in Japan with about 70,000 currently enrolled students. An unrivalled caliber of courses in 16 colleges and 86 departments for undergraduates, four departments for junior college students, and 21 schools and 78 majors for graduates correspond to a great number of academic fields and facilitate multidisciplinary studies. Nihon University offers its students a wide range of academic fields and encourages students to engage in activities across conventional dividing lines between different specialized fields. 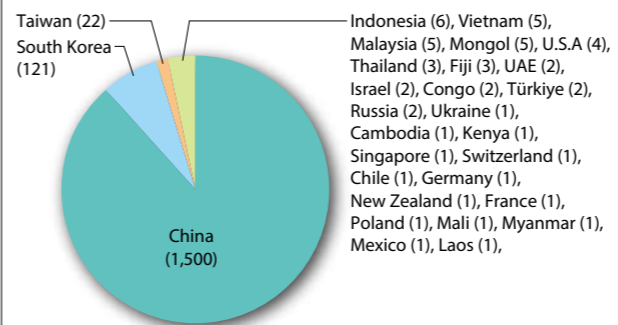

Research Activities

In fiscal 2022, the number of research projects approved for Nihon University by the Grants-in-Aid for Scientific Research (government competitive research funding) was 693 (total funding allocated among projects: approximately 1,074,840,000 yen). In terms of the number of research projects for which Grants-in-Aid was allocated, Nihon University ranks 22nd among all public and private universities and research institutes and 4th among all private universities.

School Expenses, Scholarships and Tuition Reduction Program for International Students Studying at Their Own Expense

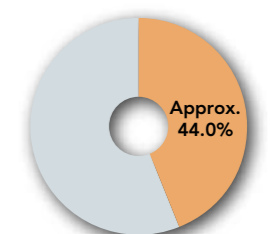
School expenses consist of the admission fee, tuition, facilities and equipment fees, laboratory fees, and others.

For details on school expenses for each college and graduate school, refer to page 13.

International students of high scholastic standings may apply and receive scholarships from Nihon University after screening at the university, as well as scholarships from various organizations in Japan. At this time, nearly 3.6% of the international students at Nihon University are receiving the University's allocated scholarships (fiscal 2022).

Nihon University also offers a tuition reduction program for international students of high scholastic standing who need financial support. An amount equivalent to 20% of the tuition of a student, who is eligible and has been approved for this program, will be exempted for this student. After admission to the college, students can apply for this program to the Student Division or Academic Affairs Section if they have the "student visa" resident status and satisfy the conditions set by Nihon University and that college.

Japanese Language Proficiency

Japanese is the primary language used in lectures and research activities at Nihon University. International students enrolled at Nihon University are required to have four Japanese language skills (reading, writing, speaking, and listening). Japanese language ability is assessed in some of the entrance examinations for Nihon University.

Generally, Level N1 of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test is required to understand lectures at a Japanese university and to lead a social life.

To acquire Japanese language proficiency in an efficient manner, students may attend Japanese language schools in Japan and in their respective countries.

The Japanese language level can be measured by the Japanese Language Proficiency Tests (JLPT) and the Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU).

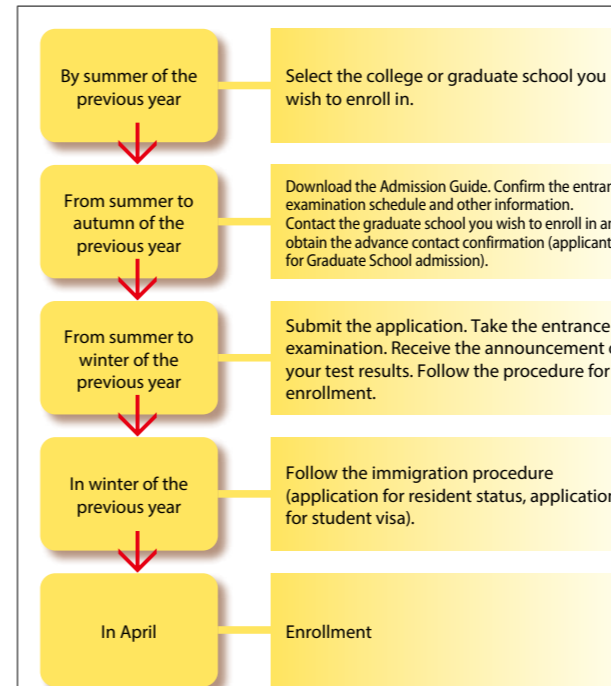

Immigration Procedures and Preparation for Your Visit to Japan

After passing the entrance examination of Nihon University, you are required to fulfill the enrollment and immigration procedures.

The enrollment procedures are completed when you submit the documents requested by the University and pay the admission fee and part of the school expenses.

After completing the enrollment procedures, you will need to obtain a student visa and resident status in Japan.

To obtain a resident status (The Certificate of Eligibility) have to submit an application to the Japanese Immigration Bureau (Proxy application for certificate of Eligibility by Nihon University.)

To obtain the visa, you have to submit an application to the Embassy or Consulate-General of Japan in your country.

Housing

The Student Division or Academic Affairs Section of the college or graduate school to which you have been accepted will provide you with housing information. There are various kinds of private rental houses and apartments near every campus. International students may select a house that suits their budget and lifestyle.

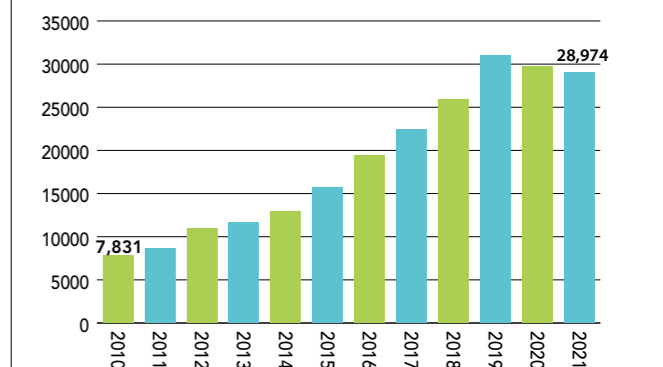

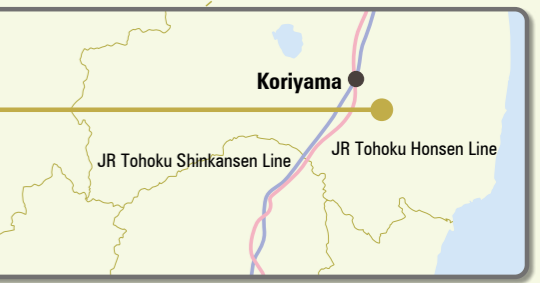

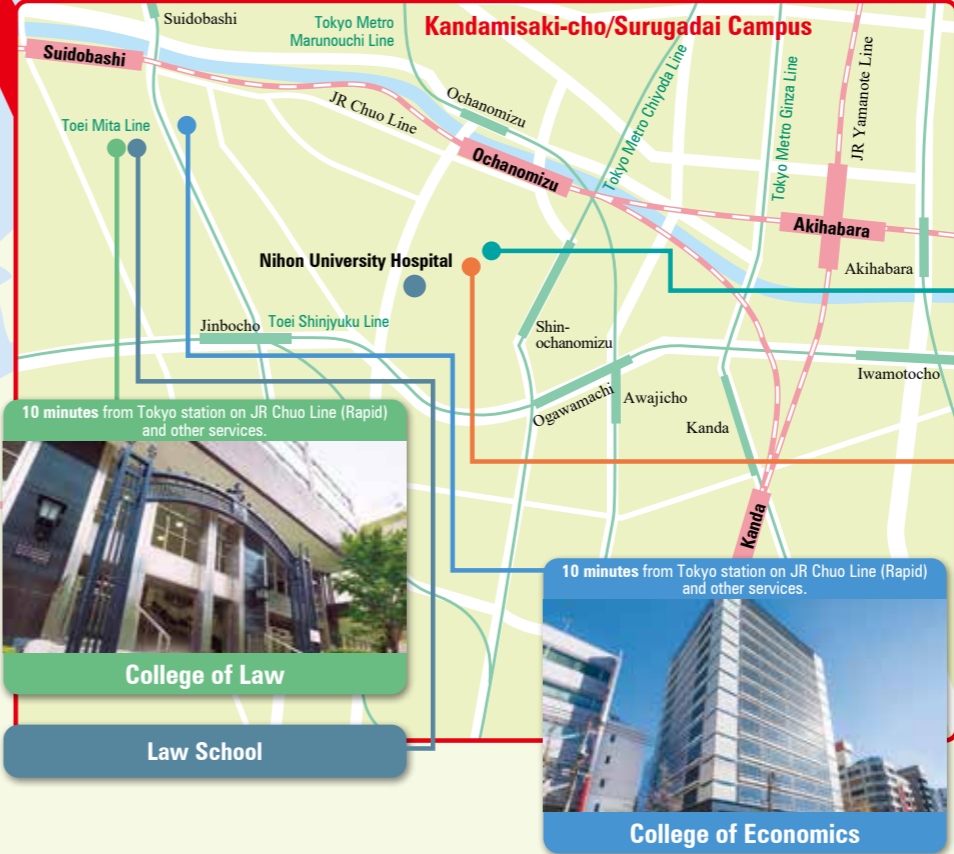
